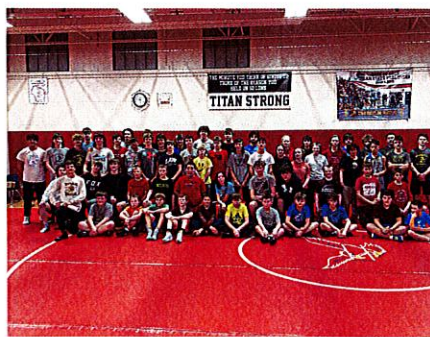
### **Middle School Building update**

Changes were made in the format of the day to provide a better testing environment for our juniors.

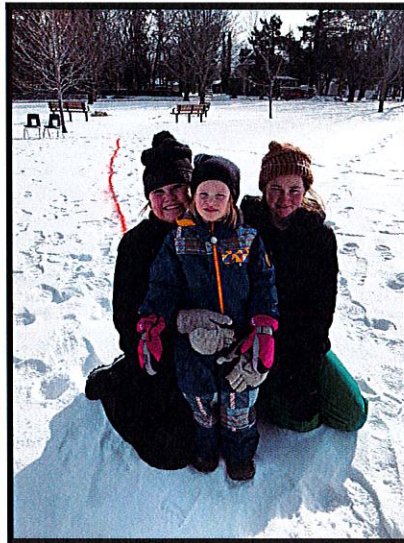
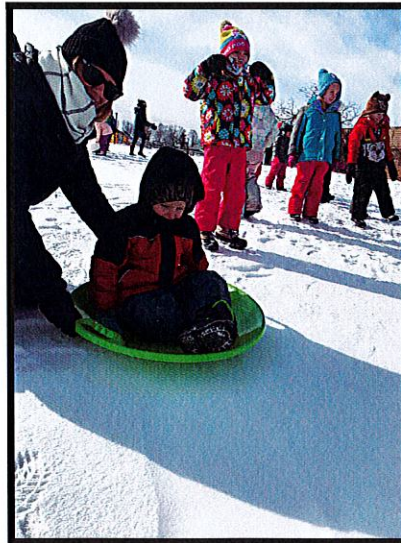
### Galesville Elementary Building Update
